## **Notice**

Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016 notified on 28.03.2016 and as amended thereof under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, stipulates that it is the duty of every Health Care Facility (HCF) to establish a bar code system for bags or containers containing bio-medical waste (BMW) to be sent out of the premises or place for any purpose. Also, Rule 5 of the BMWM Rules, 2016 stipulates that it is the duty of the every Operator of Common Bio-medical Waste Treatment Facility (CBWTF) to establish bar code system for handling of bio-medical waste. Bar Code System would help in accounting the quantity of biomedical waste being collected, treated and disposed including tracking, preventing pilferage of bio-medical waste, identification of source of generation etc.

Bihar State Pollution Control Board had published a notice in all leading newspapers directing occupiers of all Health Care Facilities (HCF) to establish a Bar – Code System for bio-medical waste latest by 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2021 and hand over bio-medical wastes to the operator of the concerned Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility (CBWTF) only in Bar – Coded bags or containers provided by them failing which legal action under suitable provisions of law may be initiated. However, inspite of the repeated requests, most of the registered Health Care Facilities (HCF) is still not implementing the Bar Code System.

In view of above, all the Health Care Facilities (which includes a hospital, nursing home, clinic, dispensary, veterinary institution, animal house, pathological laboratory, blood bank, health care facility and clinical establishment) registered with Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna for collection, transportation, treatment and disposal of bio-medical waste generated by them at "Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility" running and maintained by M/s Sangam Mediserve Pvt. Ltd. – Patna at Village – Ram Chak Bairiya, District – Patna, are hereby requested to establish a Bar – Code System for bio-medical waste and hand over bio-medical wastes to the operator of the concerned Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility (CBWTF) only in Bar – Coded bags or containers and obtain receipt.
